

FINANCIAL AID AND PARTICIPATION REPORT (FAPR)

These documents are provided to assist FCCAA members in identifying financial aid and eligibility/participation that must be reported on the FAPR. The FAPR includes two categories of financial aid, athletic aid and institutional non-athletic aid. You must list all students **signed to an NJCAA Letter-of-Intent** for the academic year and you must list all students **submitted on an NJCAA eligibility form** for the academic year. In submitting students, there are two forms:

FORM A

- A. List all students who were signed to LOI's for the academic year and the institutional athletic aid from any sources, including state/federal aid, that was provided. In reporting, you must identify foreign students.
- B. This list includes all students signed to an LOI who:
 - 1. Were listed on an NJCAA eligibility report
 - 2. Were not listed on an NJCAA eligibility report
- C. **Athletic aid** is defined as any financial assistance awarded to the student/athlete from any source because of his/her athletic capabilities **verified with an NJCAA Letter-of-Intent**. The FAPR includes two sources of athletic aid, institutional and other.
 - 1. **Institutional Athletic Aid** is athletic aid from **any** institutional funds, including Foundation funds. This is the most prevalent source of athletic aid, and is generally sport-specific at institutions. Check the **Institutional** column on the FAPR for student/athletes receiving this type of financial aid.
 - 2. **Other Athletic Aid** is athletic aid from any source other than institutional funds. Booster Clubs and Foundation are the two most common sources of other athletic aid. Check the **Other** column on the FAPR for student/athletes receiving this type of financial aid and describe the source in the **Comments** column.

FORM B

(This form requires the name of the high school, city and state for every student listed)

- A. This list includes all students **not** signed to an LOI who:
 - 1. Were listed on an NJCAA eligibility report,
 - 2. Who received institutional non-athletic aid
 - 3. Who did not receive institutional non-athletic aid
 - 4. List the name and amount of institutional non-athletic aid under the comments column
 - 5. Are Identified foreign students

B. **Institutional Non-Athletic Aid** is defined as any financial assistance awarded to the student/athlete that is not athletic aid. This category of financial aid is not awarded based on athletic capability **and is not verified by an NJCAA Letter-of-Intent.** This aid is awarded based on:

1. Must be available to the entire in-district student population.
2. Must not be awarded on athletic capabilities.
3. Must be officially recorded in and administered by the college's office of financial aid and business.
4. Must be awarded either as need based, verified by the college's office of financial aid (FAFSA), or for outstanding academic achievement with a cumulative 3.00 GPA (on a 4.00 scale) as one of the criteria published in the college catalog, office of financial aid and/or Foundation scholarship materials.
5. Must be limited to High School graduates within the serving district of the institution.
6. Must not exceed tuition, books, and fees (absolute need).

C. There are **two sources of institutional non-athletic aid**, Federal/State and other

1. **Federal aid** includes the following: Federal Pell Grant, Federal Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grant (FSEOG), Federal Family Education Loan Program (FFELP, Stafford Loans), Federal Work-Study (FWS), and Federal Perkins Loan.
2. **State aid** includes the following: Florida Bright Futures (Top Scholars, Academic Scholars, Merit Scholars, & Gold Seal Vocational Scholars), Florida Student Assistance Grant (FSAG), Florida Work Experience Program (FWEP), "Chappie" James Most Promising Teacher Scholarship, Children of Deceased or Disabled Veterans Scholarship, Jose Marti Scholarship, Robert C. Byrd Honors Scholarship, Rosewood Family Scholarship, and Seminole & Miccosukee Indian Scholarship.
3. **Other Institutional Non-Athletic Aid** is **institutional** non-athletic aid awarded from any source other than federal or state funds. This includes all merit-based and need-based aid awarded from institutional funds, Foundation funds, and private donor funds. This is a large source of financial aid. Examples include academic and leadership scholarships awarded by institutions, scholarships awarded from endowed Foundation funds, and private corporation /community-based scholarships.
4. Check the **Fed./St.** column on the FAPR for student/athletes receiving this type of financial aid and describe the source in the **Comments** column, and Check the **Other** column on the FAPR for student/athletes receiving this type of financial aid and describe the source in the **Comments** column.
